



## Sheriff Checklist

Thank you for expressing your interest in becoming a Common Law Sheriff with the National Sheriffs of Terra Australis.

Becoming a sheriff is a commitment that will not be for everyone. Usually a common law assembly would only have one or two, or maybe three sheriffs. We are in different time right now, with a rogue corporation posing as a government, completely disregarding their own legislation and imposing unlawful and illegal restrictions, fines and penalties on the people of Australia.

Legislation, rules of the corporations, are written to manage the people as the debtor, not the creditor, as we are.

We are managed and governed as chattel. A system over 720 years old.

The work of a sheriff is varied, and sheriffs and their peacekeepers are our keepers of the peace. You will attend events with other sheriffs and peacekeepers and raise awareness of the common law movement. You may make presentations to community groups to help raise awareness, serve documents to offending bodies and participate in common law court procedures as we move forward.

Below are some questions to answer to help you decide if this is a role you wish to take on.

### 1. Do you have a criminal conviction?

For our purposes - a criminal conviction is one imposed by the corporate courts, where you have caused serious and intentional harm to another. For example, murder, rape, pedophilia, grievous bodily harm, any violence against another and any harm to children.

Ideally, you will need two others to be inducted with you, if you proceed through an induction, as there is a Standard Operating Procedure in place requiring sheriffs to work in a minimum group of three.

If you are likely to be a 'lone sheriff', you will need to wait until you have at least two others in your area before you can work in the field.

If you are not in an assembly that's ok, we have a solution for that, covered in the induction.
